



CASE STUDY Letter Sound Correlation

1. How did you use Alive Studios' resources with your students?

Answer: To start our morning, students sang and danced to the Zoo Crew Alphabet Song. Then, the students reviewed (letter, pictures, sound) the Alphabet Chart. Then, the students told me words that started with the featured letter. For example, if the letter was C, they said words like car, cow, etc. I wrote the words and drew pictures on chart paper. Next, the students met the featured animal of the day with Letters alive. For example, on C day, we met Celine Cow by using the animal cards. The students listened to the animal's name, animal sound, letter name,

and letter sound.

2. What are the ELA Skills that you measured with your students to prove success in this Study?

3. What was your favorite part of Letters alive?
