

#### 1. Tell us about the students who were in this case study.

Answer: My students are in Kindergarten and are ages 5 and 6. I have 15 students, 2 are ELL, 2 receive speech services, and 2 receive special education services.

## 2. How did you use Alive Studios' resources with the children?

Answer: I measured students' knowledge of upper case letters, lower case letters, letter sounds, and just recently started measuring students' ability to read CVC words.
